Here's what you can do...

Comprehensive School Health Components:

Policy

- Review current school district smoke-free policy
- Communicate the smoke-free policy to staff, parents, students, volunteers and visitors
- Establish protocols and procedures to implement the smoke-free policy

Teaching & Learning

- Provide grade 7-12 teachers with ACT's vaping awareness teacher toolkit to educate students on the harms of vaping
- Give opportunities for students to research current evidence on vaping across all subject areas and share findings with peers

Social & Physical Environment

- Provide opportunities in your school for students to participate in a variety of groups or activities
- Post vaping awareness materials in your school
- Provide opportunities for student engagement, leadership and action to increase awareness among their peers about the harms of vaping

Partnerships

- Share information with parents and caregivers about the harms of youth vaping
- Consult with your SHPLC, school nurse, or the Alliance for the Control of Tobacco (ACT) for resources to share with your school community
